

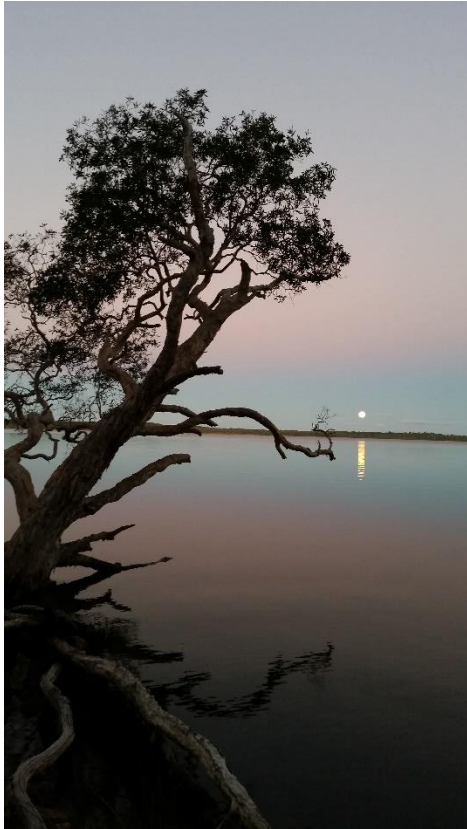


# FRIDAY ENVIRONMENT FORUM

**Lake Weyba, Then and Now**



**Guest speaker at Noosa Parks Association's Friday Environment Forum on November 9 will be Anita Brake, President of Friends of Lake Weyba (FoLW). Lake Weyba forms part of the Noosa River and lakes system and is classified as a **Wetland of National Importance**.**

Although the waters of the lake are under Noosa Council jurisdiction, the surrounding land is under both Noosa and Sunshine Coast Councils. The initial focus of FoLW was the proposed 'Noosa on Weyba' development which sought to build over 1000 homes and accommodate almost 2500 people on the shores of environmentally sensitive Lake Weyba. Currently the group's focus is on the Lake Weyba Foreshore Management Plan and the repositioning of the new Sunshine Coast Airport runway and flight path, whilst impacts on water quality, visual amenity and wildlife corridors are always monitored.

To learn more about the history of human activity on the shores of Lake Weyba, as well as Friends of Lake Weyba and their efforts to "achieve and maintain environmental excellence for Lake Weyba and the adjacent Noosa River catchment", come along to **the Environment Centre, 5 Wallace Drive Noosaville** from 10am for coffee, with the **forum commencing at 10.30am**. You are invited to enjoy the birds of Wallace Park, by meeting Valda and the Interpretive Birding group in the car park at 8.30am.
