Is this a more meaningful and effective way to live?

This week Noosa Parks Association Friday Environment Forum is taking an overall look at Tiny Housing and Eco Villages, and how this kind of more affordable, environmentally friendly mobile housing can overcome community isolation and disconnection.



Guest speaker **Jimmy Hirst** is a self-professed social engineer who is keen to share how this type of eco smart, mobile housing can overcome community isolation and disconnection, and start to regenerate the small village living model for a more meaningful and effective way to live.

“The current living paradigm” explains Jimmy, “assumes we have evolved beyond being social beings to live more like caged robots, and not actively encouraged to engage with our neighbours in houses and apartments. In fact, many of us don’t even know much about other people living beyond a wall less than 30 feet away from our beds every night. This is how ridiculous our living model has become.”

Jimmy is challenging the way western society treats the elderly and will deal with three major issues: affordability, sustainability and community.
