Wildlife corridors are critically important for the conservation and movement of plants and animals and small parcels of native bushland play a vital role in this regard. **The Wildlife Land Fund Ltd acquires and manages land to conserve our natural heritage**, complementing the work of other organisations by focussing on a network of smaller land parcels, from 5 hectares to 2000 hectares.

Wildlife Preservation Society of Queensland fostered the establishment of the WLFL in 2001 and continues to support and promote its existence. The fund relies on government and philanthropic grants, bequests and donations.

Currently about 1835ha is under management including the Bukkulla Conservation Park near Marlborough, the Witta Nature Refuge and the Neil Holloway Reesville Nature Refuge, both near Maleny. Additional lands near Tara are in the process of being gifted. A network of members, volunteers and experts helps to maintain these properties.
