## What is the future of this iconic species on the Sunshine Coast?



Despite the eastern grey kangaroo being regarded as a common species, it has declined in many areas of South East Queensland in recent years.

The impact of urbanisation on this iconic local species, is the topic for discussion at Friday Environment Forum on June 7.

The guest speaker is **Dr Elizabeth Brunton**, a long-term resident of the Sunshine Coast who has a passion for conserving our local biodiversity.

Beth is an ecologist with broad research interests including wildlife conservation, urban ecology and citizen science. She also teaches at the University of the Sunshine Coast in science, ecology and wildlife conservation.

Over the last five years, Beth's research has focused on the South East Queensland region with a view to understanding changes in abundance of kangaroos and how kangaroos are responding to the changing landscape. Beth will share some of the results of this ongoing research and insights into the future for kangaroos on the Sunshine Coast.
