### 'Feathery friends....why I do what I do'

There are many different conservation issues which have an impact on Australia's birds. The nature of these issues is often (but not always) a result of changes to their habitat. There are also other threats.

**Bob Linnane**, the guest speaker at Noosa Parks Association Friday Environment Forum on **August 16**, is focused on protecting birds from feral invasions. He says; "I love my feathered friends and travel widely throughout South East Queensland to help protect them."

Some invasive species compete directly with native birds, either for food or nesting sites.

Competition for nesting sites is one of the major problems posed by many introduced invasive species. Other invasive species simply ruin the habitats used by other species. Introduced or feral species including foxes and cats are often active predators of native wildlife, they take a great toll on our native birds.
