WILVOS Saving Wildlife

Roslyn Leslie, a WILVO volunteer, will be guest speaker at Noosa Parks Association's Friday Environment Forum on September 27.

WILVOS (Wildlife Volunteers Association Inc) is one of Queensland's oldest wildlife rescue organisations.

Operating for more than 30 years, WILVOS aim to improve outcomes for all Australian native animals. Volunteers provide rescue, rehabilitation and release services to injured, orphaned and distressed native animals.

Hear about the busy life of a WILVO volunteer and learn about the struggle our wild animals face when their habitat is destroyed.

**For animals, finding a new home is not always easy**, especially when competing with vehicles, domestic pets and other creatures resident in the area. Stress impacts the health of displaced animals causing problems such as dermatitis in possums, increasingly seen by wildlife carers.

Now that Spring has arrived, **what should you do with that tiny bird that has fallen from its nest** at the local park or in your backyard? You don't need to visit the Vet immediately. Ms Leslie will discuss some strategies anyone can use to assist the tiny fledgling.

**Join the audience at the Environment Centre, 5 Wallace Drive Noosaville to learn about WILVOS saving wildlife. Morning tea will be on offer from 10am and the forum commences at 10.30am.**

You can assist fledglings that have fallen from nests as well as their attending parents by creating makeshift nests.
